

The Specialist in School Psychology graduate program at West Texas A&M University provides the foundation for the data-based problem-solving skills of the practicing school psychologist, who makes use of the latest educational and psychological research in designing individualized and empirically validated interventions to meet the academic, social, behavioral, and emotional needs of children and youth. The program is designed to meet the requirement for state licensure (LSSP). Graduates of the program will be prepared for employment as school psychologists in public schools or other related organizations and agencies.



The School Psychology program at WTAMU has excellent and ongoing relationships with local schools, which allows the design of authentic and ongoing training, practicum, and internship experiences for students. In addition, as a smaller program, the program provides individualized personal training and accommodates student needs. The program is designed to be accessible to working students. All classes are offered on nights and/or weekends, and some classes may also contain web-

based components of training. Students may opt to complete the program on either a full-time basis, with the degree completed in 3-4 years, or part-time basis, with the degree completed in 5-6 years.

WTAMU's program not only offers a secured future and professional identity, it provides a community that follows students throughout their careers.
